# What's Cookin' in the SWRE Kitchen Keith Jonas' Baked Beans



#### Ingredients:

16 oz. bacon 16 oz. pork sausage 1 large onion 1 red bell pepper 1 poblano pepper 2 tbsp. minced garlic 1 tsp. salt 2 tsp. pepper 1/2 cup "Sweet Baby Ray's" BBQ sauce

3/4 cup dark brown sugar 1/3 cup "French's" mustard

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Brown pork and sausage in skillet. Drain grease and set meat aside.
- Cut bacon into 1/4" pieces and fry until crisp. Remove bacon and place on paper towel. Pour drippings into container for later use.
- Dice onion and peppers and fry with bacon drippings until they start to brown.
- In large foil pan mix all ingredients plus leftover bacon drippings. Bake at 350 degrees for 1.5 hours.
- 5. Bring to work to share with all of your co-workers!
