What's Cookin' in the SWRE Kitchen

Sandi Martin's Breakfast Casserole



Ingredients:

4 eggs

2 packages (12 oz each) bulk pork sausage 1 medium bell pepper, chopped (1 cup) 1 medium onion, chopped (1/2 cup) 3 cups frozen hash brown potatoes 2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese (8 oz) 1 cup Original BisquickTM mix 2 cups milk 1/4 teaspoon pepper

Directions:

- 1. Heat oven to 400°F. Grease rectangular baking dish, 13x9x2 inches.
- 2. Cook sausage, bell pepper and onion in 10-inch skillet over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until sausage is no longer pink; drain.
- 3. Stir together sausage mixture, potatoes and 1 1/2 cups of the cheese in baking dish.
- 4.Stir Bisquick mix, milk, pepper and eggs until blended. Pour into baking dish.
- 5. Bake uncovered 40 to 45 minutes or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake 1 to 2 minutes longer or just until cheese is melted. Cool 5 minutes.
